#### **Getting There:**

#### By Train

The closest station is Southern Cross. Once you exit the station, you can catch the 96, 109 or 12 tram routes and arrive at MCEC in just a few stops.

#### **By Tram**

Tram routes 96, and 109 (Stop 124A Casino/MCEC) will take you to our Clarendon Street entrance. Otherwise, tram routes 48 and 70 (Stop D5) take you to Flinders Street. From there, it's just a short walk up Clarendon Street until you reach MCEC.

#### **By Bus**

From Monday to Friday, bus route 237 goes via Southern Cross Station to Lorimer Street, which is roughly a five-minute walk to MCEC.

#### By Car

Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre has a car park located within the Exhibition Centre. Car parks at the MCEC can be booked online from \$13 per day (limited online spaces available at this rate) or from \$15 per hour via Wilson Parking here. Additionally, there are secure car parks located in and around South Wharf including, South Wharf Retail Car Park (online booking from \$13), Siddeley Street Carpark, Freeway Carpark and Montague Street Carpark.

#### By Taxi or Rideshare

Ask your taxi or Uber driver to drop you off at MCEC's Clarendon Street entrance. There are two nearby taxi ranks – Crown, Clarendon Street and DFO, Convention Centre Place.
